

Thank you for investing in the ministries of our Bridge Leaders. God is changing lives. Together, we are making a difference in America.

Bridges is growing rapidly. Now we are supporting 67 leaders, up from 40 leaders last year at this time. That's 67% growth. At this rate, we will be supporting over 100 leaders and their ministries by Jan 2016. This year our impact spread out across America with leaders now serving in Maryland, Tennessee, Washington and Indiana.



At least 460 people from outside existing churches are beginning to follow Jesus. Sam and Priya Theophylus launched Beautiful Gate this year, the first worshipping community to spin off from Bridges and become their own incorporated entity. 

Beautiful Gate Community Launched

The Beautiful Gate Community is thriving! In January, Bridge Leaders Sam and Priya Theophylus launched a Christ-following community in Los Feliz, CA, among artists and spiritual seekers. It is the first "church" in Los Feliz in 40 YEARS! In just six months they have: worshipped weekly in a rented space in the city center, led city-wide prayer initiatives in partnership with other churches, organized popular Open Mic Nights for the community, and hosted representatives from the world's largest church in Korea to train them in Bridges' missionary skills for a post-Christian context. 


We're forming a team of 10 committed volunteers . to serve in partner development.





Cissy Brady-Rogers Is bridging to women of all life

Is bridging to women of all life stages with wellness resources.

Cissy founded and directs Alive & Well Women, a non-profit that partners with women who want their faith in Christ to be at the center of changing their relationship with their body. Cissy is a psychotherapist,

university teacher, health coach, yoga instructor and certified spiritual director. Through workshops, retreats and consultations, she helps women like Sharon Song find compassionate, life-giving ways to care for themselves even as they pour out their lives for others.

Sharon Song

How one woman's life was changed

Over-caffeinated, over- sugared, over-stressed, over- committed is how Sharon Song described herself. She was on the verge of burnout and completely disconnected from what her body really needed: "Alive and Well helped me learn to listen to my body— especially the stress that was telling me I needed better self- care. I learned that loving and caring for myself is a way to connect to God's love for me." Sharon lives and works in South Los Angeles with an urban ministry community. Inspired by her own transformation, Sharon became a certified fitness trainer and is training to be a spiritual director. She's committed to using what she's learned to support others in living healthy, sustainable, urban spiritual lives.

At Bridges, we don't train people and then send them into ministry. We find people doing ministry. and offer them the support and training they need.

Self-Assessment Surveys

Collaborating with Assessment specialist, Dr. Gaithri Fernando, Bridges finalized 5 surveys to measure Bridge Leaders' growth. Taken annually, the assessments help Bridge Leaders understand their strengths and weaknesses and celebrate. their development over time.

We provided 540 Coaching sessions to Bridge Leaders this year.

For over a decade, Bridge Leader Connie has run "Operation Love" in North Hollywood, sharing the love of Jesus to neighbors by providing



food, clothing, school and medical supplies. But it was just recently that Connie realized, "Hey! I've been doing another ministry for much longer than this — I just didn't think of it that way." Connie realized that her time on the phone "counts" as ministry. For decades Connie has had the phone to her ear, pastoring and mentoring relatives who don't go to church, friends from her youth who haven't left their old lifestyles, and people that her own pastor refers to her. It is not uncommon for her to spend hours of her week listening to, encouraging and praying with these folks. Thank God for Connie's powerfully redemptive use of technology! 

God's Mountainside Surprises

Here's Bruce's story in his own words:

Hiking has become an "accidental ministry." It is a surprise. Sometimes I hike alone and don't see anyone for 8 or 9 hours. Sometimes there are other hikers, and only a few words are exchanged. However, there are times when someone needs help or directions or water. Sometimes I've needed help or directions or water. Then someone has ministered to me. Most of the folks on the trail are (shall we say) "outside the church." I don't ask them about their faith; but some ask me what I believe, what I do, why I changed from physics to ministry. Some tell me about their beliefs, questions, and fears.

Last week, on the way down from Jones Peak, another hiker called out to me. We walked down together. We talked about trails he had built and mountains he had climbed. We talked about his professional tennis career, the aneurysm that nearly killed him, his personal faith, his upcoming divorce, and the fact that he's living out of his car. That took an hour. In the parking lot, we spoke for another 30 minutes. He had shared a lot about his beliefs and the crises he was facing. I asked, "Do you want me to pray now?" He said, "Yes."

We prayed. And we said we hoped to meet again on the trail.

Make disciples as you go, submerge them in the Trinitarian reality, and train them to do everything that I commanded you. And look-I am with you until the job is done.
