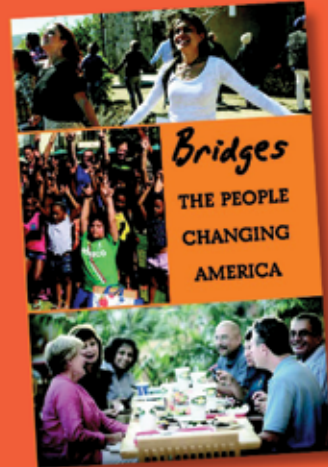

Bridges. Our Purpose and Vision

The purpose of Bridges is to train a new type of leader for a new model of church, bringing together both old and new, that spreads across America and transforms one community after another.



Bridge Leaders gather Disciples into groups that follow Jesus.

Bridge Leaders serve part time. They learn to join groups, befriend people, and make disciples outside of church culture. This new type of leader creates a life style that is free to serve people who are outside the existing church without requiring payment, neither from those they serve nor from existing churches. If they do need compensation, they learn how to raise funds from Christians who are committed to their ministry. When they do gather disciples into groups, they do so in low cost ways that don't require owning property or buildings.

THE PAST 12 MONTHS



Accelerating through the Coronavirus Pandemic

Bridges is designed as a post-internet, online support platform for a multiplying movement that does not depend on high cost things such as buildings, full-time Christian workers, and large group gatherings. Therefore, our ministry actually increased in intensity and volume during Covid-19.

We Moved All Support Groups to Zoom

When Support Groups began meeting face to face again, we used social distancing and face masks.

We modified our 3-day annual training into shorter monthly trainings by Zoom.

Some Bridge Leaders started new events such as:

- daily mom & daughter devotions led via Facebook
- raising money from friends, buying meals from restaurants, and then serving meals to people in a homeless shelter
- pasta dinner competitions via Zoom

How We Made a Difference

Impact of our Ministry over the past 12 months.

Bridges supported 50 leaders leading 50 discipling ministries among 50 different types of people groups in four different States around the USA. Rather than give them monies that might help them this year but not create a sustainable base, Bridges gives them the services they need that enable them to grow not only their ministry but also the support base that their ministry needs to succeed year after year. Bridges provided assessments, trainings, mentoring, coaching, nonprofit status, counseling, support groups, fund development training, accounting, and more. And this year Bridges was excited to grow our own base for our ministry so that we can serve a lot more leaders in the years to come.



Building relationships across cultures is core of what Bridges does.



To prepare to scale our supporting ministry services, Bridges:

- finished the first year-long training program for new Coaches.
- established a monthly training program for Support Group Leaders.
- automated weekly financial reports for 26 ministries.
- standardized accounting procedures with monthly reconciliation and close.

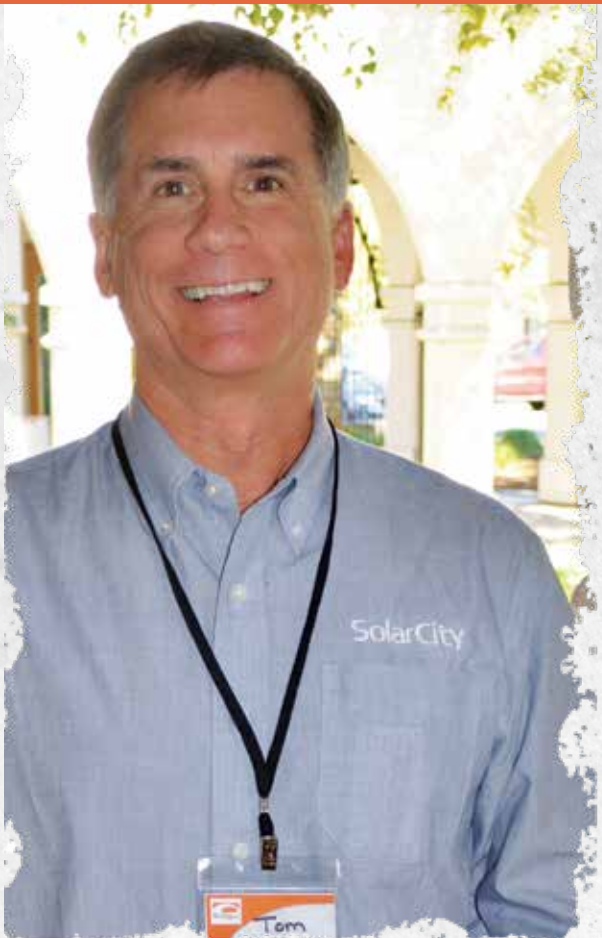
Measurable Results:

Bridge Leaders on average participate in five unchurched groups, influence 63 people, have 15 intentional friendships, and seven disciples. Over the past 12 months, of those surveyed this past June, each leader had joined two more groups, influenced 13 more people, made one more friend, and made one more disciple among people outside of faith.

Bridge Leader Organizes a New Church

Bridge Leader Norm Gordon launched a new Christ-following community. Norm was able to transition to serving full-time the "Germantown Global Connection." They have mobilized to serve their community during Covid-19 by:

- delivering food to quarantined families
- raising funds, buying meals from distressed restaurant owners, and delivering the meals to hungry people in homeless shelters
- collecting fresh vegetables for a local food bank when the grocery store would not sell to the food bank in bulk due to rationing during Covid-19

Program Goals

1. Recruit 10 more Bridge Leaders in 12 Months
2. Add two more Support Groups
3. Train four more Coaches
4. Train two more Support Group Leaders
5. Double the amount of funds raised for program ministries from about \$360,000 to \$660,000

Scaling Goals

1. Change the incentive structure for paying mentors for Fund Development to increase the results for Bridge Leaders in funds raised
2. Transition to the Sage Accounting Software System
3. Increase Ease of the On-Boarding Process for Bridge Leaders through Web Portal Development

Advancement Goals

1. Recruit five more congregational partners for training leaders
2. Recruit 10 more businesses for Sponsorship Partnerships
3. Expand the Bridges Board of Directors to six Board members with diverse networks

Major Project Goals

Bridges has a list of major projects that can be accomplished if funds become available.

1. Creating a Web-based Portal Service Delivery System (\$100,000 Phase I)
2. Creating an App for accessing services for Bridge Leaders (\$50,000)
3. Installing a new accounting system for scaling to 1000 leaders (\$40,000)
4. On-line Store (\$10,000)
5. On-line Assessment Center (\$25,000)
6. Legal Compliance, HR Compliance, Trademark registration, copyright registration to protect Bridges into future growth (\$15,000)
7. Installing a new accounting system for scaling to 1000 leaders (\$40,000)
8. Hiring a Program Director or Operations Director or Product Manager to expand Bridges' overall capacity to serve Bridge Leaders (\$50,000 PT/ \$100,000 FT)

Financials

BRIDGES FINANCIAL REPORT

Summary Explanation

Bridges plans to add 10 Bridge Leaders to our ACTS Services program. The services provided to each Bridge Leader cost approximately \$5000, so that increases Bridges cost by \$50,000.

Bridges ended the last fiscal year this past June 30 with a deficit of more than \$63,000. Over \$26,000 of this \$63,000 is from a PPP Loan. Bridges plans to get this \$26,000 forgiven within a few months. Bridges is

king to rectify last year's deficit and create a reserve fund for managing cash flow by ending the next fiscal year with a surplus of approximately \$77,000.

Bridges does seek to reduce operating costs each year and spread that cost over more Bridge Leaders, thereby increasing our efficiency and effectiveness. Any funds in excess of budget will be used to train more Bridge Leaders.

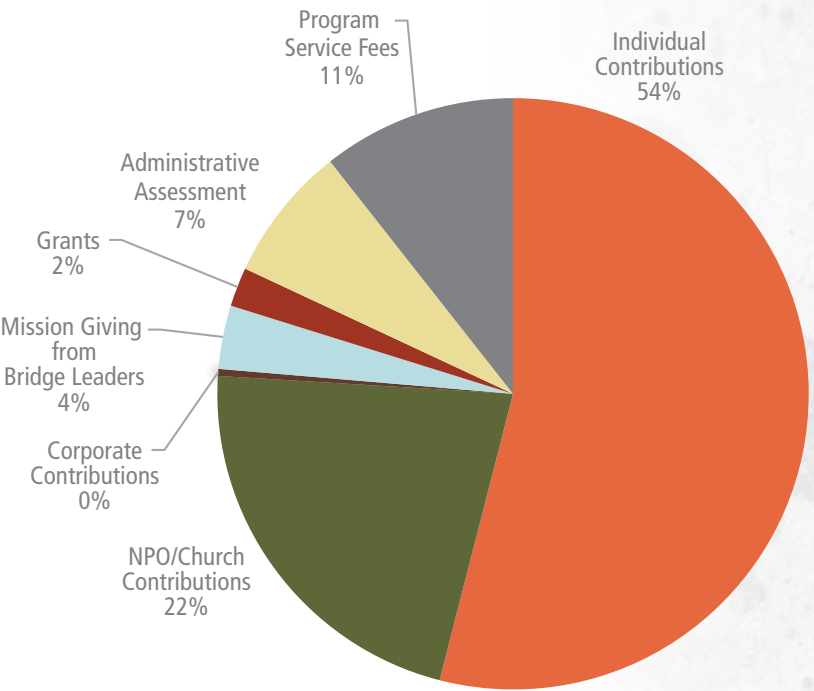

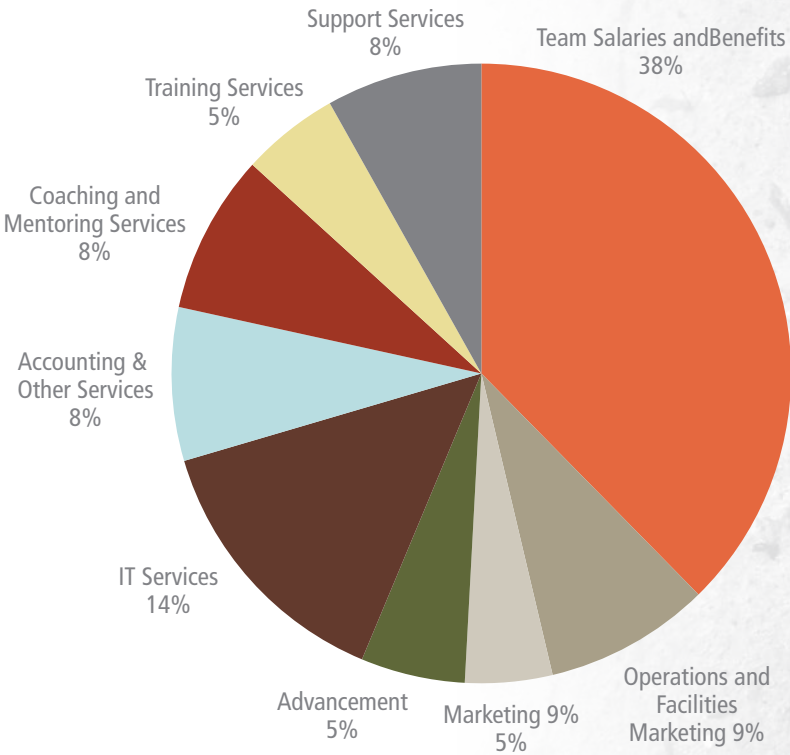
